- 1) Motion to approve Project Budget *Dr Meg Cavalier
 - a) TenSquare, TAG, and I are closely monitoring the budget. We have spent a large portion of the construction contingency on correcting environmental soil issues through the removal and disposal of contaminated soil and on worse than normal winter conditions that were exacerbated by the delays at the start of the job. We have grant funds from the state and Ramsey County to help offset some of the environmental remediation expenses and from the federal government's E-rate program for IT expenses. As we are moving to a less risky phase of the work, we have reserved contingency funds for overtime and acceleration expenses (\$50,000), additional soil remediation for the parking lot area (\$85,000), and \$100,000+ for additional unanticipated expenses. We have also begun to free up some construction contingency funds for add/alternate construction options the school has requested, such as additional gym equipment, whiteboards in the classroom, and bulletproof glass for the windows at the entrance and University Avenue. b) St. Paul City School is planning to invest \$650,000 to \$700,000 for tenant improvements from a combination of cash on hand and federal grants. These tenant improvements include a playground, AV systems for the gym and the cafeteria, improved IT infrastructure, kitchen equipment, and gender-neutral bathrooms.

There are four relevant major federal grants being utilized to support the school mission and vision over the next 3 years. The grants have "finance codes" that align with their intended purpose (i.e. 153, 155, 160, etc). We have carefully planned so that these grants are financing their intended purpose, and align with necessary spending for our support for students. The revenue from these grants is being applied to costs that would otherwise come out of our regular general education dollars. It is fortunate to have access to as we prepare to move facilities and improve the learning experience for our students in one building. These grants allow us to make the necessary investments in materials and supplies for our new facility without pressuring the existing budgets for our student programming, intervention, and support staff. There is a net-zero difference to the school's operation budget since we have not allocated all the federal grants.

Specific spending planning for federal grants:

- Expenses for technology that supports updates and necessary instructional tools for the new facility classrooms (FIN153).
- Allowing investment in materials, equipment for the new facility by covering operating costs and freeing up budget for investment in learning environments (FIN155).
- Investing in our intervention, student support, and family engagement team also allows our budget over the next 2 school years flexibility in operating in our new facility (FIN160).

The funds from the school's cash reserves could be reimbursed by Charter School Property II Inc., with equity freed up by the sale of the Virginia Street property in May or June, or free cash flow generated by the difference between the rent paid by the school and the debt service required.

St. Paul City School anticipates these items will be added to the project using change orders and be funded through the construction draw process with the school providing its funds to the Title Company.
